RE: James Webb Space Telescope (JWST) project

The Italian Association of Researchers in Astronomy and Astrophysics (A.R.I.A.A.: http://www.ariaa.org/) is concerned by recent developments possibly affecting the future of the James Webb Space Telescope (JWST) and join to the concerns of other national and international societies.

JWST promises to be one of the world leading instruments for the coming decade in astronomy focusing on the many questions related to the origins of planets, stars and galaxies. Many major developments in world astronomy, like the ALMA array and the giant telescope E-ELT, are being designed and developed taking into account the expected capabilities of JWST. A large part of the worldwide astronomical community, including many Italian astronomers, has planned their research programs for the coming years building on JWST capabilities, trusting that it will be launched as planned. The loss of JWST would therefore damage astronomy in a major way in the USA, and in the World.

Beyond the loss in the financial investments, in human resources allocated to the program, and in the progress of our knowledge of the Universe, the end of the JWST programme would also jeopardize the crucial educational role than the Hubble Space Telescope provided the common people, and not only scientists.

The members of the Italian Association of Researchers in Astronomy and Astrophysics hope that fruitful solutions will be found to complete the JWST programme.
